



2017 National Conference for Second Language Educators

On April 7 & 8, the 2017 National Conference for Second Language Educators was held at Shaw Conference Centre. The Confucius Institute in Edmonton was one of training program in the University of Alberta.

During the visit, the group toured the office, library, teachers' office and other facilities.

They also attended a presentation by Dr. Wei Li on the operation and development of the CIE, the Edmonton Chinese Bilingual Program and the Alberta's education system.

The delegates also had the opportunity to meet with some of the Chinese visiting teachers posted at the CIE.

After lunch, the delegation paid a visit to Meadowlark School, which is one of the six Chinese bilingual elementary schools in the Edmonton Public District. The assistant principal, Jei Yin, welcomed the delegates and provided an introduction about the school, and the dedication to the Chinese bilingual program. The delegates also had the opportunity to visit 11 classrooms, observing students learning Chinese and even talked to some students and teachers. A good discussion followed the interactions in classrooms.

The visit was short but the delegates learned a lot about Confucius Institute in Edmonton and the Chinese bilingual program. They were impressed at the achievements of the Confucius Institute in Edmonton and quality of the Edmonton Chinese Bilingual Program.

the sponsors of the conference which was attended by around 720 second language teachers from across Canada, among whom were about 30 Chinese language teachers. The CIE visiting teachers also attended the conference.

Two sessions were provided which related to the teaching of Chinese language. Dr. Liang Tian, the Chinese special language advisor of Alberta Education, gave a presentation on effective strategies for the teaching and learning Chinese vocabulary, exploring a number of learner-centered ideas and strategies that focus on the teaching, learning and enrichment of Chinese vocabulary. Her discussion was well received by the teachers.

A second presentation was made by Jenny Li and Kathy Gu, two Chinese teachers of EPSB. Their topic was dealt with the approach to learning in language lesson plans, which will serve to design teaching practice to produce effective inquiry learning. Their vivid presentation attracted a lot of interest and attention from the audience.

The CIE also had a booth set up at the conference to display information about the institute, as well as the support and services the CIE provides to the Chinese language and culture programs in Edmonton and throughout Alberta.



The First Edmonton Oriental Culture Festival

The First Edmonton Oriental Culture Festival was held on April 9. The festival was organized by the Oriental Cultural Community Service Centre and the Confucius Institute in Edmonton. It included an oriental gala and a presentation of a number of Chinese films.

Around 400 people watched the gala at the John L. Haar Theatre. The gala included a variety of performances such as dancing, Instrumental numbers, singing, martial arts, drama, Beijing opera, a Qi Pao show and comedy cross-talk. Indian dancers and a dance group from Poland which performed national folk dances. The CIE teacher Du Jinjin also performed a Chinese dance, and four CIE teachers delivered their best wishes to the audience.
