The 700 seat theater was packed and the world class performances, with beautiful singing, costumes and wonderful martial art action, had a lot of cheers from the audiences.



2017 Spring YCT/HSK Tests

On May 2 and 3, the Confucius Institute in Edmonton organized the 2017 Spring HSK/YCT tests in Chinese language proficiency. Close to 1300 students from grade 3 to 12, from fifteen schools sat for the tests.

In order to ensure a successful administration, the

CIE and teachers and administrators from the participating schools put a lot of time and effort in preparation. With all the support and help from 15 school administrators and teachers as well as CIE visiting teachers, the two days of testing ran successfully and smoothly.

On May 20, more than 40 students also took the HSK test for university students and community members, including some students from neighbouring school districts like St. Albert, Red Deer and Lethbridge.

The YCT & HSK assessments are international standard tests on Chinese language proficiency, just like English TOEFL. Students can use this credential to apply for scholarships to study in China and to support a resume seeking employment, where a language skill is valued. It will also help the students to build their confidence and motivation to learn Chinese.



After 10 years of offering the YCT and HSK, this test has become very popular and an important part of the Chinese language learning in our Chinese programs. The testing center of Confucius Institute has become one of he largest testing center in North America.



Graduation Ceremony for Spring Session of CIE Mandarin and Culture Classes

On May 29, the graduation ceremony of the 2017 CIE Winter Session was held at the Confucius Institute in Edmonton. More than 70 students and their families and friends attended the ceremony.
