Dancers from Confucius Institute in Edmonton and Ross Sheppard High School also performed traditional Chinese dances. The event promoted the Chinese culture and enhanced the multicultural heritage that exists in Edmonton.

All tickets were sold as over 600 people attended the performance. 


CIE Fall Session
